Sarah Nowak, PhD is an Associate Professor at the Larner College of Medicine in the department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine, and is a member of the UVM Cancer Center. Dr. Nowak studies patient and provider decision making in the context of preventive health decisions, including cancer screening and vaccination. She takes a systems-level approach to her work, incorporating methods from complex systems, behavioral science, and health services research.





Brian Sprague, PhD is a cancer epidemiologist and Professor in the Department of Surgery at the University of Vermont. His research includes observational studies of breast cancer risk, detection, and survivorship. Dr. Sprague leads the Vermont Breast Cancer Surveillance System (VBCSS), a research program that collects data associated with screening and diagnostic breast imaging at radiology facilities in Vermont. He is Principal Investigator of numerous grants from the National Cancer Institute and co-leads the Cancer Population Sciences research program within the University of Vermont Cancer Center.

Lauren Ressue, PhD is a public health analyst in the Division of Health Statistics and Informatics at the Vermont Department of Health. She has worked with both the Comprehensive Cancer Control Program and the Asthma Control Program since 2021. She previously worked in the field of refugee resettlement at both the local and national levels.





Nancy Kaplan, MS currently works at the Larner College of Medicine at the University of Vermont. She is a Research Navigator for the Northern New England Clinical & Translational Research Network. Prior to this role, Nancy managed the You First cancer screening program at the State of Vermont Department of Public Health.

Kerry Goulette, PA-C, MHP serves as the Director of Quality, Risk & Compliance at the <u>Community Health Centers</u> (CHC). She graduated from College of Holy Cross and received her Physician Assistant certificate and Master of Health Professions from Northeastern University. Before arrival at CHC in 2006, she worked for Lynn Community Health Center and Boston Medical Center in Massachusetts. Her professional interests include adult medicine and preventive health. She is currently focusing on patients experiencing homelessness.

Polly Macpherson, MS has 40+ years experience in the not-for-profit sector in direct service programming and program administration, most recently specializing in heath education and fund raising.
